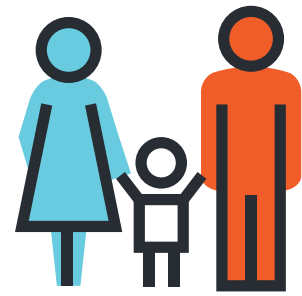


Health Insurance for Immigrants.



Everyone qualifies for coverage during COVID-19.

Health coverage allows you to see doctors or go to the hospital when you get sick and it protects your family from high medical costs. Immigrants can get health coverage in New Mexico. New Mexico residents qualify for free or discounted insurance based on income. Legally residing immigrants can qualify for premium discounts at [beWellnm](#).

COVID-19 testing is free and there are federal programs to pay hospitals for COVID-19 treatment.

Emergency Medical Services for Aliens (EMSA) is available to cover the costs of emergencies for families who are not eligible for Medicaid due to their immigration status.
